Admission Requirements:

- Apply for regular admission/readmission and be accepted by the college.
- Submit a completed application for the Associate Degree Nursing program to the Office of Healthcare Education in the Phil A. Sutphin Hall.
- Achieve an ACT composite score of 18 and a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher.
- Complete prerequisites with a grade of "C" or better in each course prior to taking the first nursing course: Anatomy and Physiology I and II with labs (or upper-level equivalents with labs) and Microbiology with lab (or upper-level equivalent with lab).
- Complete HESI A2® with Critical Thinking Pre-entrance Test and complete a satisfactory criminal history background check with the Office of Healthcare Education.

Scholarships and Financial Aid:

CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND REQUIREMENTS

Associate Degree Nursing candidates are required to schedule fingerprinting with the Office of Healthcare Education prior to admission. Fingerprints are submitted to the MS Department of Public Safety and run through the Mississippi Criminal Information and Federal Bureau of Investigation databases for criminal history background checks. A satisfactory background report is expected of all students. If a student has a disqualifying event, the student is personally responsible for seeking removal of the event. Program admission eligibility may be rescinded based on review of the criminal background check and will be rescinded upon refusal to submit to a criminal background check.

If the person has ever been convicted of a felony, or pleaded guilty to, or pleaded no contest to a felony of possession or sale of drugs, murder, manslaughter, armed robbery, rape, sexual battery, sex offence listed in Section 45-33-23 (f), child abuse, grand larceny, burglary, gratification of lust or aggravated assault, felonious abuse and/or battery of a vulnerable adult they will not be eligible to participate in required clinical experiences. Other offenses may be classified as disqualifying based on the Mississippi Attorney General's Office of interpretation. The list is not all inclusive of felony offenses and may include misdemeanors.

Students who are dismissed from a Healthcare Education Division program have the opportunity and are encouraged to seek admission into another educational program at East Central Community College.

Enrollment in nursing courses is limited to students who have been admitted to the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program. Courses must be taken in the sequence specified unless otherwise stated. All nursing courses must be completed with a "satisfactory" within four years to graduate from the ADN program. Successful graduates will receive an Associate of Applied Science Degree with 70 college credit hours.

Progression/Graduation Requirements:

- Semester grade average of 80 or above in all semesters and courses requiring letter grades.
- Grade of "C" or better on all nursing and other required courses
- Mastery demonstration of selected nursing skills.
- Satisfactory achievement in all clinical rotations.
- Complete all required assessment tests.
