Millie Morrow Scholarship – The Millie Morrow Scholarship was established by her son, Michael Morrow, to honor his mother and encourage students to study, work hard, and be the best they can be. Millie Morrow was born in the 1932 in rural South Carolina to a sharecropper's family. The youngest of nine children she learned to work hard. They didn't have much but that's all she knew. She missed so much school helping her family work in the fields she didn't graduate high school, but she didn't let that stop her. Finally getting a job at the phone company in Charlotte, North Carolina as a telephone operator, she started at the bottom. She would even send money home to help her mother. Her hard work and dedication were rewarded as she eventually retired as a supervisor.

The Millie Morrow Scholarship will be awarded for four semesters. To be eligible, a candidate must:

- Enroll as a full-time freshman student at ECCC;
- Plan to major in Carpentry Technology, Heating & Air Conditioning Technology, Electrical Technology, or a home construction field of study;
- Reside in the college's five-county district;
- Have at least a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale; and
- Preference will be given to female applicants with financial need.

The ECCC Foundation Scholarship Committee will select the scholarship recipient. The scholarship will be awarded for the fall and spring semesters of the recipient's freshman and sophomore year. The amount of the scholarship award will be based upon earnings from the endowment corpus. No part of the corpus may be used for scholarship awards. Only the interest earned on the endowment corpus will be used for the scholarship award.

There will be no refund to the student for money not used to fund his/her education at ECCC. In the event a scholarship is not awarded in any year, the interest that would have been used to fund the scholarship will be deposited in the scholarship endowment.
